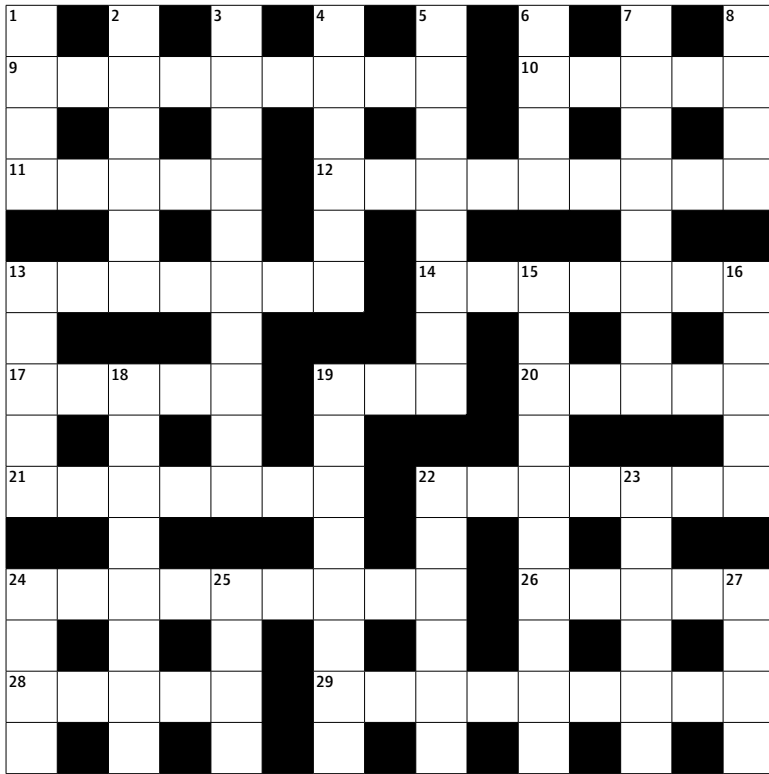


# Guardian cryptic crossword No 29,984 set by Imogen
